Quick Checklist

- Is urgency clear and managed?

- Are we making smart trade-offs, not just fast ones?



- Narrow the scope and sequence aggressively
- Set non-negotiables and communicate priorities daily
- Protect your team's energy and focus
- Create psychological safety for hard truths and fast learning
